



Nature Walking Map

We encourage all our visitors to enjoy the campus grounds at leisure. You will find several scenic spots with picnic benches around the lake area and a small footbridge over the river into the wetlands where a level gravel path provides easy walking towards Ickleton village.

The route around Ickleton village offers a picturesque walk through our parkland and wetlands as well as a church and post office along the way. It takes approximately 30-45 minutes depending on your ability. Please note that there is a stepped footbridge into the wetlands, a small hill to negotiate in Ickleton village and the lanes are narrow and lack pavements in certain places. The Red Lion in Hinxtton Village is a tradional pub providing excellent food & drinks and a lovely beer garden - booking is advisable at peak times. Exit/Entry to Hinxtton village is achieved via the intercom on the North Gate.

Respectfully, the greyed-out zone is a private area and therefore we ask you to keep to the marked pathways as detailed above.

*Malaise trap - used to collect insects for genomic sequencing with primary school children, as part of our on site Tree of Life Programme.

Warning: Please be aware that there are two level crossings along the walking routes and we ask that you do not climb over any locked gates within campus grounds - if you find them locked please exit/enter site via the North Gate using the intercom. Please contact reception if you need further information.
